

Convention Keynote Speakers



Dr. Min Zhou, Professor of University of California, Los Angeles

Dr. Min ZHOU is currently Professor of Sociology and Asian American Studies, Walter & Shirley Wang Endowed Chair in US-China Relations & Communications, and Director of Asia Pacific Center at UCLA. She is holding visiting professorships at a number of universities in China, including Zhejiang University, Sun Yat-sen University, and Huazhong University of Science and Technology. She

was Tan Lark Sye Chair Professor of Sociology and Director of the Chinese Heritage Centre, Nanyang Technological University, Singapore (2013-16), and was the prestigious Changjiang Scholar Chair Professor of Sociology at Sun Yat-sen University, China (2009-2012). Dr. Zhou's main areas of research include: international migration, immigrant transnationalism, ethnic entrepreneurship, the new second generation, ethnic/racial relations, Asia and Asian America, and Chinese diasporas. She has published widely in these areas, including 17 books and more than 180 journal articles and book chapters.



Dr. Qi-Long Ying, Associate Professor of University of Southern California

Dr. Qi-Long Ying is an Associate Professor of Stem Cell Biology at the Eli and Edythe Broad Center for Regenerative Medicine and Stem Cell Research. He obtained his bachelor's degree in medicine from Southern Medical University, Chin in 1987. Qi-Long earned his MSc and Ph.D. degrees from the Department of Neurosurgery, Huashan Hospital, Shanghai Medical University. From 1995-1998. He did his first postdoctoral

study in Prof. Houyan Song's laboratory in the Department of Molecular Genetics, Shanghai Medical University, and he then joined Austin Smith's group at the University of Edinburgh. During his years with Austin. In 2006, Qi-Long moved to USC to set up his own laboratory. His current research focuses on understanding the molecular basis of embryonic and tissue-specific stem cell self-renewal. Qi-Long was honored with the McEwen Award for Innovation at the 2016 International Society for Stem Cell Research annual meeting in San Francisco, USA.
